Postern of the Pastor

Be it resolved.

Have you ever seen that phrase posted after public meetings? It simply means a "firm decision has been made – and here it is...." Whatever that decision might be.

I think you know where I'm going with this with the new year upon us. Any resolutions? Diet? Exercise? Lay off the screens? Read more? Last year I challenged the congregation to read the New Testament. This year, let's amp it up. How about the whole Bible?

WHAT!?!

Back up the truck. Let's read the whole Bible in two-years. Is that manageable? A little more bite-sized? In this edition of the newsletter you'll see Genesis and a little bit of Exodus mapped out. I would also like to create some check-ins with this. If you have any questions, comments, that sort of thing – please, **ASK**. I may not have all the answers – but I will try to help you to a fuller understanding of the Bible. Send me an e-mail. Send me a text. Be it resolved that – aside from diets, exercise, being nicer to people from Ashippun, and the usual fare – deepen your faith by being in the Word. It allows us to have a deeper, fuller understanding of the faith – encouraging us to make Jesus known and to evangelize.

And that's what the Epiphany is all about. Below is a reflection from our NALC "Echoes and Epiphanies" Devotion, written by Pastor Amy Little:

The tradition in the Church arrived to see the infant Lord up to two years after His birth and not immediately in an outbuilding in the holds that the wise men who sought the King of the Jews. more than likely, the City of David. However, the important thing here is that God revealed the Christ child to the wise men— and He continues to reveal Christ to people every day. That's what the season of Epiphany is all about: God revealing the truth of the Messiah, God in the flesh, to the world.

In my previous devotion on Christmas Eve, I wrote about entering the temple and how it required worshippers to be pure and blameless in the sight of God. When Jesus came among us to live with us, it showed us that, as St. John said, "he pitched his tent and lived among us" (John 1:14). In the original language, "He tabernacled with us." This phrase hearkens back to the Exodus journey where God had His own special tent, the tabernacle, that the Israelites set up at each stop along the way.

This was sacred space and God dwelt among His people for forty years in this manner.

We often think of the church as the place where Jesus resides, the place where we can find Him when we need Him. But according to St. John in Revelation, the temple in the coming kingdom is the Lord Jesus. In the vision God gave to John, he noticed that there was no temple to go to—not in the whole city of the New Jerusalem! Rather, it is Christ Himself who is the temple. Why would this be? If you think about it, if we are fully in the presence of God, then we have no need for a physical place to go and worship Him.

The promise is that God will live among his people, He will be accessible in a way that we have never fully known. No more, "It's time to go to church." Instead, the object of our devotion will be physically present, within reach, walking beside us, communicating with us, loving us. God won't have to offer any further revelations or epiphanies to His children, it will be obvious to all who love Him that we are in the presence of the divine Creator of all that is. God will fully reveal Himself to His people, and we will dwell with

Him in His eternal glory. What happened long ago was a foretaste of eternity.

Be it resolved. God is with us.

Be resolved with God, but read what your Council President has to say for some considerations ahead.

hether located in towns, the

farmlands, or out in the prairie, the North American Lutheran Church's mainstay is small and rural congregations. While other faith communities look for ways to close and minimize these churches, the NALC values these parishes as they continue to seek avenues to enhance ministry and make disciples for Jesus. Like all other congregations, small and rural missions face both challenges and opportunities.

Small and rural churches deal with dwindling memberships, aging parishioners, lack of finances, older buildings, conflict, fewer resources, and memories of the past. While these challenges are real, they cannot thwart the resilience of these parishes and the opportunities. Too often in the church, we are asking the wrong question. Instead of asking, "What do we need to 'bring in' to do ministry", we should be asking, "What has God already blessed us with to do ministry?" The Holy Spirit continues to provide the small and rural church with the talents and abilities of its people to make Christ known in their communities.

Sadly, many small and rural churches feel "less than" their larger counterparts. This is due to a lack of programming, size, and staff. The worst thing that a congregation

can do is compare itself with another. Every church is different and has a unique opportunity to share Christ and his saving love. Specifically, what are some of the advantages of a small and rural congregation?

Relationships: In towns and villages, relationships are paramount. It is in these personal relationships where neighbors help others, and Christ can be shared. A smaller church is a natural place for these bonds to be nurtured and deepened. These relationships assist in developing and maturing discipleship.

Aging: While many might conclude that an "aging church is a dying church," they are missing the mark.

While a majority of small and rural churches have older members, this should be recognized as an asset. Ministry and evangelistic efforts can be centered around this age group. Also, bringing older adults, teens, and younger children together in intergenerational ministry can enhance discipleship growth.

Pastor Repp strongly agrees with this!

Participation: If a smaller congregation is going to prosper, then many will have to be involved in ministry. This is the beauty of this size church. The talents of the members are needed for service,

outreach, and keep the parish going.

Flexibility: While rural and village congregations may not be known for flexibility and nimbleness, they are. Smaller churches can respond more quickly to adapt and re-tool to changing situations in the communities that they serve. These advantages and others show why the small and rural congregation is the "backbone" of the Christian Church in America.

Realizing their value and importance in sharing faith, the Mission Office of the North American Lutheran Church, specifically the NALC Renewal Team, has developed an online course entitled, "Small and Rural Church Ministry."

This comprehensive learning module is structured with the following components:

- Struggles
- Importance of Relationships
- Gift of Aging and Intergenerational Ministry
- Discipleship
- Equipping
- Outreach and Evangelism
- Attitudes
- Technology and Digital Ministry.

This course is easy to use and is recommended for pastors, church members, leadership teams, and others interested in strengthening small and rural ministry. Pastor's Challenge

Here it is. A Two-Year Reading Plan of the Bible, beginning at the... beginning. *Can you do it? Can you commit?*

The daily readings are roughly based on consistency and topic – which is why the chapters vary per day. This plan is loosely based on the Two-Year Reading Plan found on page lix of the Lutheran Study Bible.

The first book of the Bible is one of the most important – Creation – Fall – Noah - Abraham, Isaac, Jacob/Israel, to Joseph in Egypt. This early on, the Bible expresses both Law and Promise. Women have a strong role. Faith and trust are vital. There are also plenty of nuances that raise questions from the Two Trees to the Nephelim to Melchizedek to the Binding of Isaac. Genesis is a dramatic and exciting read – anything but boring.




